Additional Information from TMA:

Physicians who treat workers' compensation patients are urged to become familiar with the ODG ® Guidelines, special spine guidelines, and drug formulary.

Work Loss Data Institute ODG® Guidelines: As of January 1, 2016, the Tennessee Bureau of Workers' Compensation has adopted the Work Loss Data Institute ODG® Guidelines ("ODG® Guidelines") for the criteria used to determine the recommended treatments for injured workers in the State of Tennessee. The guidelines are not mandates but designed to speed up the claims processing and payment process for clinicians in a majority of cases by establishing guidelines for medical necessity. If a physician needs to deviate from them, the reason should be documented. The Bureau's website contains information about how to access the guidelines. Spinal Injury Treatment Guidelines. In addition to the ODG® guidelines, a Supplemental Spine Study Group of the Bureau's Medical Payment Committee has proffered Tennessee-specific guidelines for treatment of spinal injuries which should be considered by utilization review organizations in evaluating the medical necessity of treatment for certain spine injuries. TMA highly recommends that when a patient is treated for an injury covered by the Tennessee spine guidelines, that the physician submit a copy of the special guidelines to the utilization review organization along with the claim and supporting documentation. The Supplemental Spine Study Group's guidelines can also be found at the web address above. TMA recommends that if utilization review organizations deny medical necessity for treatment falling clearly under the Supplemental Spine Study Group's guidelines to submit such denial to the Medical Director of the Bureau specifically referencing the case's applicability to the Study Group's guidelines.

Drug Formulary. Also, the Bureau's new drug formulary may be found at https://www.tn.gov/workforce/article/wc-drug-formulary. For first prescriptions written and dispensed for the affected medications after January 1, 2016, the drug formulary will apply after August 28, 2016. For refills of medications with prescriptions written before January 1, 2016, the drug formulary applies after February 28, 2017.
