HOUSE OF DELEGATES

The Nashville Academy of Medicine was honored once again to have the largest delegation in attendance at the TMA House of Delegates in 2024. Our delegation included representation from small and large groups, hospital staff, residents, students, and retired physicians. The TMA House of Delegates debated a variety of topics with impacts on physicians and patients, and the house took action within the following five areas:

- Preserving the integrity of physician-patient communications
- Ensuring physician autonomy in hospital settings
- Supporting children's physical and mental health
- Preparing for the emergence of artificial intelligence in medicine
- Protecting physicians' ability to provide evidence-based maternal healthcare

American Medical Association (AMA) President-Elect Bruce Scott, MD, addressed the House ahead of his upcoming term as President of the AMA. Dr. Scott spoke of his outlook as upcoming AMA president, and he encouraged physicians to join in supporting the work of the AMA through membership. The House of Delegates will reconvene on May 17 at the Embassy Suites in Franklin, TN.
